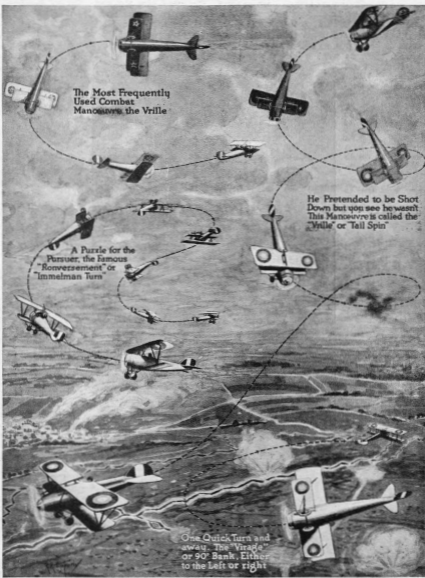


## TRICKS THE FIGHTING AIRMEN PLAY



The Most Frequently  
Used Combat  
Manoeuvre, the Vrille

A Puzzle for the  
Pursuer, the Famous  
"Roulement" or  
"Immelman Turn"

He Pretended to be Shot  
Down but you see he wasn't  
This Manoeuvre is called the  
"Vrille" or "Tail Spin"

One Quick Turn and  
away. The "Virage"  
or 90° Bank, Either  
to the Left or Right

At the top on the left you see a most useful manoeuvre, the "vrille." The pilot banks sharply and dives, then straightens out. To the right the same manoeuvre repeated in a series of loops, mimicking the action of a machine which is out of control. In the centre to the left the "Immelman turn" is represented. The flyer climbs as if about to "loop the loop," but instead, he twists the machine about and straightens out at a higher level. In the lower right-hand corner is shown the quickest way to turn an aeroplane—the "virage."
