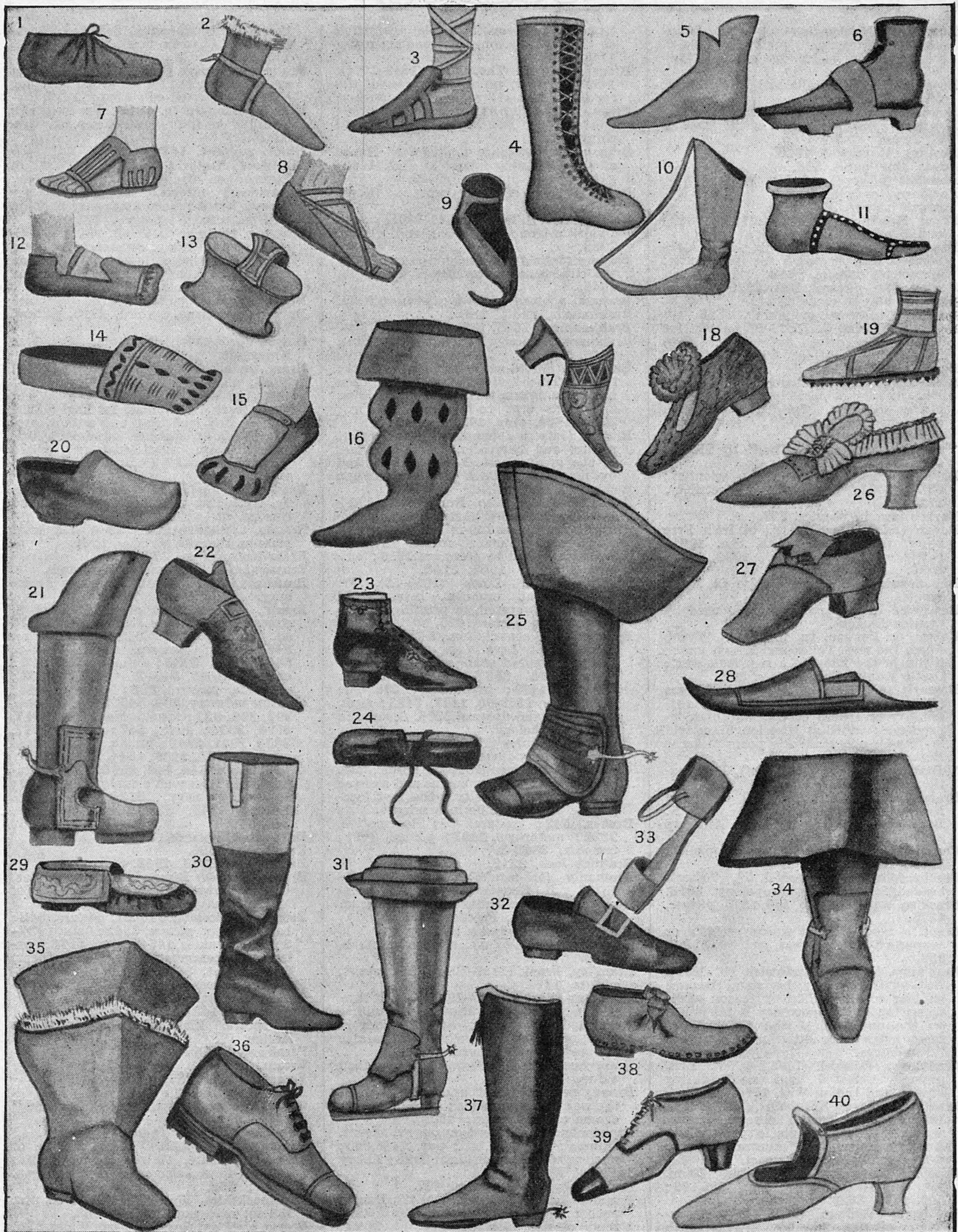


THE MARCH OF BOOTS AND SHOES DOWN THE CENTURIES
